Thank you Hashem that we had the merit to have gone through a beautiful, illuminated, sweet, holy Yom Tov. We didn't eat any Chometz, we ate the holy Matzos. The Yom Tov didn't pass us, The Yom Tov is in us. It cleansed

us and brought us up closer to Hashem. This Shabbos we will be eating Chometz, some call it Shabbos Gella Matzos, or we make a key on the Challah - Shlissel Challah. The children will ask, Tatty, what is this Shlissel? The Shlissel is to show that Hashem holds in his hand the key of Parnosah. Chazal said in Tannis, there are 3 keys that Hashem didn't give to anyone and only Hashem has it, one of those keys is Parnosah. We eat this Challah to remind us that Parnosah comes from Hashem.

When kids speak about their friends and other children that do things that are not modest, it is important to strengthen them and teach them to do what is right. Tell them who is good to be friends with, and who is not good to be friends with. This is the only way we will merit to have Ehlicher Doros.

Chazal said in (Yerushalmi Kedushin 1:7) that Reb Shimon Bar Yochai said that Hashem requires us to give our father and mother more honor than giving honor to Hashem himself. Therefore, you need to be very careful not to answer back to your parents. Especially when our parents are older and get more sensitive, then we need to be even more cautious than in their younger years.

### The Rosh Yeshiva Says:

You should know that we need to have a lot of patience in life. Specifically with Tefillah and Hisbodidus when we see that we beg Hashem and we don't see any results. We need to have a lot of patience not to give up, and not to despair. The holy Chachamim said in (Brochos 32b), If a person asks Hashem for something and doesn't see any outcome, he should beg again. Just as it says in the Pasuk in (Tehillim 27:14) We must be stubborn with Tefillah and keep on asking Hashem again and again until we see salvation.
