Right now we are saddened over the destruction of the Beis Hamikdash. However, we must know that the holy Gemorah says, "Whoever has sense", meaning whoever knows that there is a creator of the world, whatever you see, all sorts of creations is all a outer clothing of Hashem. Therefore, "Whoever has sense, is as if this person has the Beis Hamikdash". What is destruction? Our minds and hearts are destroyed! We forgot that there is a creator. When a person gives himself completely over to Hashem, that everything is Hashem, such a person has the Beis Hamikdash.

1:196), "A person can not demand from Hashem, because Hashem will do to him as he wishes", therefore "We must beg with mercy just like we would ask someone to have mercy on us, then if Hashem will help him, it will be good, and if Hashem will not help him then, No". Fortunate are those who ask Hashem for anything.

The Rosh Yeshiva Says:

We must beg Hashem that we should not get fooled in this world. The Rebbe said in (Sichas Haran 51), "Accept this from me, the world is fooling you, don't get fooled". The Rebbe also said in (Sichas Haran 6), "The Yetzer Horah is compared to a person who runs in between people with closed hands and fools everyone, they all think that he has something in his hands and therefore they are running after him, then afterwards he opens up his hands and there is nothing there. This is the Yetzer Horah, he talks us into running after him, and in the end we leave this world empty handed.
