Hashem Himself Will Guard

The Parsha opens with "Vehaya Eikev Tishmaun, Veshamar Hashem Elokecha Lecha Es Habris", The Rebbe said in (Lekutei Mohahran 1:169), When a person is happy, Hashem guards him from bad Aveiros. Because the Aveirah of Pgam Habris only comes from bitterness and depression. The Klippa that causes this Aveirah is called by the term 'Crying'. The holy Chachamim said in (Vayikrah Rabah 11:7), 'Vehaya' means 'Simcha', therefore 'Vehaya' if a person is happy, then Veshamar Hashem Elokecha Lecha Es Habris, Hashem himself will guard him from Aveiros.
