The Rebbe had a dream that on Rosh Chodesh Elul he wanted to hear the sound of the Shofar, so he started to look around for a house that would have a Shofar. Suddenly, he passes a house and hears the sound of many people dancing and clapping their hands with happiness. The Rebbe thought that this house would be a good place to hear the Shofar because here they have Simcha. The Rebbe shared with us his dream to teach us something, that if you want to do Teshuva during Elul and hear the Shofar, you must be happy, only with Simcha. Every Mitzvah that we do with Simcha is completely different.

In this week's Parsha we speak about going to

war. The holy Rebbe said in (Sichas Haran 120), just like by a physical battle we look to put a fear onto the enemy where they would run away, yet we ourselves need the strength not to get scared. The same is true by a spiritual battle, the Yetzer Horah wants a person to become weak and scared. This is the test of the war, that the person should not become weak, not to get scared, not to worry, and definitely not to get broken from it, only to wait for salvation. Not to run away, and not to Chas Veshalom run away from Hashem.

simple Jew, do the will of Hashem. Be happy and joyful, make others happy, smile to everyone. A Breslever Chusid once said that the greatest talent is someone who has no talent and serves Hashem with Simcha and Emunah. This is higher and stronger than any talent.

The holy days of Elul and Tishei is a time that Hashem gave us of mercy, a month that we can start anew. It is brought down from Tzadikim, (Lekutei Torah Parshas Re'eh 32:2), a parable of a King who is inside his palace for the entire year, only the highest ministers can enter into the palace. One time a year the King goes out into the fields. Then all the field men and farmers can speak to the King. The same is with the month of Elul. It is a time that everyone can come speak to Hashem and beg for mercy.

To guard our eyes, and not to think 'Na it's not for me', but rather Yes, it is for me! I am going to be a Tzadik. I am not going to get upset. I am going to want and yearn to serve Hashem even though it's not going well for me. This way, Hashem will help us merit to become big Tzadikim.

Always carry around with you a bag of Seforim, a small Chumish, a small Mishnayos, a small Tehillim, and when you have extra time you should read through the Torah.
