All questions should be asked to Das Torah, but with this there is no one to ask, even if your family drags you to Das Torah etc., you should sit there with respect. Don't argue at all, and do what you need to do, if you know what's good for you and for your soul, because the Rebbe clearly stated in (Sichas Haran 14), "We should ask a Tzadik everything except when he says not to come to him for Rosh Hashanah, this is something we don't listen to him about.
