The Rosh Yeshiva Says:

The Pasuk in this week's Parsha says, "Today, you shall cross the border of Moav and Ar". The Rebbe teaches in (Lekutei Moharan 1:272) that in order to be successful, one must look only at Today. Not at the past, not at the future. "What are my responsibilities right now?" we must constantly ask ourselves. "What can I do to maximize 'this day' to its fullest?" This approach

will result in success in the material matters, and even more importantly, in the spiritual realm as well. In order for us to overcome the wickedness of Moav and Ar, the forces of evil that distance us from Hashem, the key is to take the lesson of, "Today". If we will reject all thoughts of the past or future and not allow them to intimidate us we will be Zoche to success in all areas.

The holy Rebbe said in (Sichas Haran 120), "There is nothing worse than giving up". Just as the Chachamim said in (Sota44b), To give up in the middle of a battle is the worst surrender. Even if we feel like we're tapping the wall in the dark, we feel like the worst person and we bring all sorts of proof that we're worthless, still we need to yearn to be a Tzadik, to be good and never go away from Hashem. By revealing the light of Hashem to every Jew, Mashiach will help us constantly feel His loving embrace. We'll talk to Hashem continuously and ask Him for whatever we need, as the Navi prophesized (Tzefaniya 3:9), "At that time... all nations will call out in the name of Hashem."
