Rashi said it is because the Shevatim disgraced Pinchas. This is Chizuk for us as to why we need to get disgraced when we come to the Breslever Rebbe. We come to a place where we learn the Rebbe's holy Seforim and where we speak about the advice and encouragement of the Rebbe, and people have degrading things to say. Yet we must remember that all Tzadikim from every generation that bring people close to Hashem have been shamed before.

Her friends asked her, Udel, how can it be that we were all in the mud and you came out clean? She said, this is what I learned from my father, the holy Rebbe, "When we go into the mud we should not get dirty". A person has a Yetzer Horah, he goes into the mud Aveiros. does this that mean he shouldn't Daven, say Tehillim or put on Tefillin? No, the Rebbe said don't get dirty. Even though I fell, I am not dirty, I am still a son of the King, I am Hashem's child.
