What's Breslev Chasidus? The Rebbe reviews with us Emunah. That Hashem controls everything, creates everything, and does everything. The Rebbe said in (Sichas Haran 33), "By the world Emunah is something small, but by me the main thing is Emunah without any deep thought or smart thinking. Rather with simplicity, like the way women and simple people believe. The Rebbe doesn't let us sleep, The Rebbe wakes us up, to run to Hashem and to talk to him, to thank and praise him. The more we speak to Hashem, the stronger our Emunah absorbs inside of us.

The Rebbe once said to R' Nosson, (Sichas Haran 279) "When things get really bad, be Mevatel yourself - nullify yourself completely and give everything over to Hashem." R' Nosson asked, "How can a person attain this level?" "By closing your eyes and remaining silent in the face of difficulties - that is Bitul," The Rebbe replied. In a difficult situation, if you want to survive, you cannot question Hashem's ways. Why?" is a question for Goyim. A Yid knows that everything is perfectly planned out for him, that Hashem makes no mistakes and does everything for his benefit. At a time like this, you must close your eyes and accept what Hashem brings upon you.

The Torah doesn't say "Honor your son and daughter", The Torah says in (Shemos 20:11), "Honor your father and mother", to honor your parents. Parents must teach their children that they need to honor them. Demand from your children that they should obey you. It's very important for a father to ask his kid "Bring me a drink" or the like. It's very important for a mother to tell her kids, "Pick up your clothes", or "Clean up the toys". It's a great pity on those parents who let their kids be undisciplined to the extent that they serve the children.
