Don't be scared to say something at work that no one should speak with foul language. Don't be afraid of anyone, because either they will stop speaking with foul language or you will start speaking with foul language. There is no such a thing sitting together with someone who speaks dirty and it doesn't influence you. Don't let anyone speak with foul language. The holy Rebbe said in (Sefer Hamidos Ois Nivul Peh 3), "Through this Aveira of speaking Nivul Peh, bitter struggles and bad decrees are brought to the world. Young children die C"V and no one hears their screams."

Torah Is The Foundation

The Rosh Yeshiva Says:

After the mishkan was complete, the shechina descended and rested upon the mishkan, and later in the beis hamikdash. Although there is no mishkan today, this passuk still holds true. Every person can make a place for Hashem inside

himself by turning his mind and heart into a mikdash me'at. How can one accomplish this? The first of the keilim that is described in the passuk is the aron: the home for the luchos. Torah is the foundation of Yiddishkeit; when a person learns Torah, he "brings the aron inside himself" and the shechina will dwell with him.

We read yesterday that Hashem wants us to bring a Half Shekel. Hashem wants us to do our part, just simply start, do something, read Kriyas Shema today, Go now to Shul to Daven, Guard your eyes this time, start saying Mishnayos, even if you know that you won't learn tomorrow, do half, just start, you don't need to completely do the whole thing, even a Half Coin. The Rebbe said in (Sefer Hamidos Tzedaka 2:19), "By giving Shekalim, we are saved from the Yetzer Horah", because if we only do our part, then we can come back to Hashem.

Penny By Penny

Mohorosh always lived by everything he said. After his marriage, he embarked on the grand endeavor to print and distribute the Rebbe's sefarim with mesirus nefesh. He tremendous amounts of money, accumulating debt of approximately eighty thousand dollars nearly a million dollars today! His finances were so tight that he couldn't afford fish or meat even for Shabbos. Mohorosh and his wife would eat a meager fare of challah and sardines every Shabbos. Nonetheless, he repaid his debts down to the last penny. How? Gradually, penny by penny. Mohorosh used to engage in hafatza sharing sefarim of the Rebbe with others and asking for a small donation in return. At the end of each day, he immediately went to the printing shop with the money he had earned by collecting tzedaka - some days he brought fifty dollars, some days one hundred dollars, and some days a mere twenty dollars - until he repaid every penny that he owed. Mohorosh pledged, "One who will engage in hafatza will always have money when he need.
