Fortunate is the one who speaks to Hashem a lot, he will only have good in this world and the next.

A Day Of Tefilah

Purim is a day of Tefilah. Chazal said in (Yerushalmi Megillah 1:4), On Purim,

"Anyone who sticks out his hand, receives". Whatever a Yid asks from Hashem during the holy day of Purim, he gets. This is what Mordechai Hatzadik taught us, when a person has a problem, go to Hashem and Daven. Chazal said in (Megilah 12b), Mordechai Hatzadik had many names, " Ben Yair" because he brought light to Yiden through Tefilah. "Ben Shimi" by begging Hashem a lot, Hashem heard his Tefilah. "Ben Kish" Kish is a term for banging, he banged on the doors of Shamayim to have mercy on the Yiden, and the doors were opened for him.

Whatever He Wants

It's brought down from Tzadikim (Sefer Yesod Yosef 1), that on Tanis Esther those who need a Yeshua should say Chapter 22 in Tehillim, and beg Hashem for whatever he wants, he should also remind himself of Mordechai Hatzadik and Esther Hamalka, and he will definitely be helped. Therefore, make sure to utilize the day for Torah and Tefilah. Even though you're busy doing a thousand other things, still try to get to say a few words to Hashem. We can't imagine what every word that we say to Hashem does, especially if a person does Teshuva then Hashem forgives him immediately.
