father"? Rashi answers, that Hashem knows that a person has less fear of his mother. He loves his mother more, and therefore he honors his father less. That's why when it comes to honor, he needs to honor his father first and then his mother. However, when it comes to fearing them, we must be more careful about how we treat our mother.

The greatness of a Yid is he knows nothing, understands nothing, and he doesn't want to know and understand, because there is nothing that we can understand. If we ask for something and we don't get it, we can't ask, "Where are all my Tefillos?". If we ask such a question, it shows that we don't have a strong Emunah. We must

believe that every Teffilah goes to Hashem, and Hashem takes all the Teffilos and only does what is good for the person.

If a person thinks that once he will have this and that, then he will be happy, it might be that once he will have it, it will be more comfortable, but to be happy we must beg Hashem from within ourselves.
