The Rosh Yeshiva Says:

Speak to everyone about the greatness of the Tzadikim. Tell them what they are privileged to receive from the holy Rebbe. This will bring you respect and you will be successful in everything. The Rebbe said in (Lekutei Moharan 29), Everyone likes to hear good words, when you speak with good words, and you speak positive, people will hear you out. Therefore, when you speak good words, everyone will listen to what you have to say. However, if you do not speak with nice words, your words won't be accepted. How can a person achieve to speak positively, and effectively for people to listen to him and to accept what he has to say? This is when one speaks wisely, and when he speaks with sensible words, then there is good in his words and everyone will accept it, but if not, then his word won't be accepted. The Rebbe concludes: How do you come to speak wisely? That is when we speak about the greatness of Tzadikim.

Reb Nosson wrote in (Chayei Moharan 475), "I heard from Reb Yitzchok who was the Travitzer Magids son in law, that the Rebbe said we need to be very careful about going to the Mikvah when we are traveling, and it's a Segulah to be saved from Criminals". When the Rebbe revealed the 'Tikun Haklali', the Rebbe said, "The first thing is Mikvah". When a person goes to the Mikvah, he washes his soul, at the same time when he is cleansing his body here in this world, he is cleansing his soul up in Shamayim.
