The Concept Of Hisbodidus

There was once a Chabad Bucher, 'Nuta' who came to Uman and heard about the concept of Hisbodidus. He was drafted into the Russian army and sent to Siberia. He was given work in their offices where there was a non Jewish girl who worked there. Every day this girl tempted him to be with her. He always denied and went to the forest and screamed, "Hashem, this I can not handle. Either I will die or I will fall into an Aveirah". This went on day after day for three years until Hashem answered his prayers. The commanders told him that tomorrow is his last day and they are making him a party. This girl asked to speak and said this boy is a righteous boy, as he did not give up and was not persuaded to be with me. When this Bucher came back to Uman, the elders were crying when they heard his story. He said that if he didn't know about the idea of Hisbodidus, he would have fallen.

This is such a good story, a really good story, because people like major remedies, yet here we have the merit to have the holy Rebbe, and Mohorosh told him to take the Tefillin, just put it on and everything will be fixed.
