When a person can't stand on his own, he watches himself falling and falling, he needs to go to a Tzadik who can give him the helping hand to stand on his feet. The Rebbe said when a person

is connected to a Tzadik, he won't fall. The true Tzadik teaches him how to behave and how to stay strong in every situation, and this will help him not to fall. We must beg Hashem a lot that we should find the real true Tzadik who can really help us, rather than going to people who fool us into thinking that they can help us.
