The Rosh Yeshiva Says:

The Zohar Hakadosh says, that when the Pasuk in this week's Parsha writes Noach twice, it is referring to the upper Noach, and the lower Noach. Noach is a term for patience, and the Rebbe writes in (Lekutei Mohoran 1:6), that there are two ways of serving Hashem, one when everything goes

the way we wish and the other is when things don't go as we wish. Many times people think that they can only serve Hashem when everything goes well, however, there is another way to serve Hashem, when we are struggling, then we still need to continue serving Hashem. Mohorosh explains this to mean that when someone has both Noach's, then he is an "Ish Tzadik" and he will succeed.

The reason could be that if we wake up early and we Daven, we will have Parnasah, because if we sleep in till the middle of the day, then how can we have Parnasah? Hopefully you will accept my words and renew yourself to go Daven on time and with a Minyan.

Keep strong. The Rebbe told Reb Nosson in (Chayei Moharan 555), "Do you know who Hashem loves? A burnt out Yid. Someone who is going through some real difficult challenges and he holds himself together. Strengthen yourself with simple faith, even if you're going through hardships and you feel like you can't handle it anymore. The Rebbe told Reb Nosson in (Sichas Haran 279), " If things are really bad, then you need to waiver yourself. Reb Nosson asked, "How can you waiver yourself?" The Rebbe answered, "By closing your Mouth and Eyes, this is subservience".
